Adolescent and Adult Immunization Certificate Program

This program will enable you to return to your pharmacy prepared to administer immunizations.

While immunization rates for children have improved dramatically in recent years, many adolescents and adults are not adequately protected against dangerous diseases. Each year in the United States, as many as 50,000 to 70,000 adults die needlessly from vaccine-preventable diseases or their complications. Influenza, pneumonia and hepatitis B lead the list. For every child in America who dies of a vaccine-preventable disease, about 400 adults die of such disease. **As the most accessible healthcare professional, pharmacists are uniquely situated to play a role in improving adult vaccine-preventable morbidity and mortality.**

This twelve hour program combines homestudy, lecture and a hands-on workshop to prepare pharmacists to provide immunizations.

OBJECTIVES

After completing this program, participants should be able to:

- ◆ Describe the basic function of the immune system.
- ◆ Explain clinical features of influenza, pneumococcal pneumonia, hepatitis A & B and tetanus vaccines and the clinical decision making involved in vaccine use.
- ◆ Understand the opportunities and limitations of pharmacist administered immunizations per California state pharmacy law.
- ◆ Complete a Medicare provider application and prepare a HCFA 1500 form for billing purposes.
- ◆ Demonstrate proper vaccine administration technique and management procedures for bloodborne pathogens and hazardous materials waste.

HOMESTUDY

The first part of this program consists of a six hour videotape which will provide an overview of the principles of vaccination and general recommendations for influenza, pneumococcal, hepatitis A and B, tetanus, diphtheria and varicella vaccines. The presenter in the videotape is William Atkinson, MD, Medical Epidemiologist at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Prior to attending the live program, participants are required to view six hours of videotapes, submit and pass an exam. Please be sure to give yourself ample time to view the videotapes and to take the test.

LIVE PROGRAM

During the first part of the program, information about reimbursement and marketing immunization programs will be presented. A pharmacist-attorney will give an overview of California pharmacy law as it relates to scope of practice and the ability of pharmacists to administer immunizations. The final two hours will be spent in a hands-on workshop which will provide participants experience in administering injections. Participants will be required to demonstrate proper injection technique prior to receiving their certificate of completion.

Participants will be required to be certified in CPR prior to receiving their certification of completion. This program does not include training in CPR. Opportunities for receiving CPR certification will be included in registrants' confirmation letters.
